Dear Parishioners,

This has been a year of opportunity as we forge our path as a parish family through the Beacons of Light Process. We are making deliberate, thoughtful decisions in regard to programmatic changes and staffing. Fr. Tom Wray was appointed as the Director of Evangelization and Bill Mountel, from St. Vincent Ferrer, was appointed as the Director of Stewardship. Laura Martin, from All Saints, was hired as our Director of Communications serving both parishes and schools. We are beginning our search for a Director of Worship.

We held our first combined Service Blitz Day in October between the two parishes. This was a huge success, giving individuals and families multiple opportunities to serve their community. This is being repeated on Saturday, October 21. Please save the date!

We carefully looked at our weekend Mass schedules to see how we could best accommodate both parishes while also utilizing our priests and deacons most efficiently. One Sunday Mass was eliminated and the time of two of the Masses was changed so that they did not coincide.

We continued a joint RCIA program, offered shared Bible Study programs and continued with combined Sacrament preparation. Similarly, our FLOCK/PREP program had excellent enrollment and this year is combined into one program for our parish family.

On the horizon, we need to explore a combined Worship Commission, combined Pastoral Council and Finance Commissions. We also need to identify a name for our parish family. Please keep your eye on our bulletins and emails for updates and ways you can help in this process.

It has been my pleasure during my first year as your pastor to get to know many of the parishioners at All Saints and St. Vincent Ferrer. Thank you for welcoming me. I look forward to meeting more of you this coming year.

St. Vincent Ferrer Financial Report July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2023







Church Overview

- Mass attendance increased 9% over the previous year. With the Beacons of Light planning process, we modified our Sunday Mass times to 8:30AM and 10:30AM. The 10:30AM Mass time continues to be live-streamed for those unable to attend due to health reasons.
- Capital improvements through the year included: furniture for the Jaspers Room, church stained glass window repair and storm window replacement, church sound system upgrades, rectory air conditioning, and parish center video intercom and security camera system additions.
- With a generous donation, we were able to pay additional principal on the loan, bringing our loan balance down to \$318,905.

School Overview

- School enrollment continued to be steady with a total of 151 students. This included 18 little ones in our PreK program.
- We continue to provide a strong Catholic based education for students from several surrounding parishes in addition to SVF. In the 2022-23 school year, SVF students came from 21 different zip codes and 16 different school districts.
- Almost \$17,000 in Tuition Assistance was awarded from SVF Parish and donations to Tuition Assistance were just under \$13,000 for the year. The Archdiocese CEF provided \$9,300 in scholarships to students.
- Capital improvements through the year included: a cafeteria freezer for the school lunch program, and school video intercom and security camera system additions.
- 100% of our 8th grade class were admitted to their first choice high school and received a total of \$190,000 in scholarships.
- We began classroom renovations to allow for an additional preschool level classroom for 2023-24.
- A \$30,000 donation was received to be used toward classroom updates and renovation work for an additional preschool level.

Parish Overview

- We concluded the first year of the Beacons of Light pastoral program. The year included participation in the Disciple Maker Index survey.
- Our sacramental programs resulted in 19 Baptisms, 14 First Communions and 11 Confirmations. We had no weddings and 19 funerals.
- We registered 22 new families, bringing our current registered families to 538.
- We continued gathering as community with several events, including: Wine Tasting Social (Parish Life), Epiphany Day (PTO), Spaghetti Dinner (PTO), Lenten Fish Fry's (Athletics), Service Day Blitz in October and additional service days in the spring to spruce up the grounds.

All Saints Financial Report July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2023



Church Overview

- Sunday offerings increased by 1% over the previous year. Many thanks to our generous parishioners.
- The Festival netted \$71k this year. Decreased ride sales, raffles and increased expenses were offset by sponsorships. Thanks to all of our volunteers!
- The Fish Fries were back after a several year hiatus. They netted \$6.6k this year. That is decreased from years past. Food costs increased and we had a couple days of bad weather. We'd love to have your help in the future.
- Mass attendance continues to increase, but we are still not at pre-Covid levels. We are seeing a significant decrease in liturgical ministers.
- Significant maintenance and repair costs challenged us this year. With aggressive management of our budget by the staff we ended the year only \$6k over budget.

School Overview

- School enrollment this fiscal year, 2022-2023, was 492.
- \$39,351 in Tuition Assistance was awarded, a decrease due to more students on EdChoice.
- Cost of tuition increased by \$200 per student this year.
- Administrative Cost Reimbursement back on track this year at approximately \$438/student.
- We continue to invest in our 1:1 device program for all of our students.
- We continue to invest in our teachers as we work to make their salaries more competitive with their public school counterparts.
- We graduated fifty-four 8th graders who earned \$808K in scholarships.
- 97% of our All Saints graduates are attending Catholic High Schools.
- Our school lunch program partnership with St. Albert Nutrition has been a huge success.

Parish Overview

- Our strength, flexibility and our faith in All Saints continues to shine through as operations are back to normal.
- The parish center/gym is busier than ever. Our meeting rooms are booked and sports programs are flourishing.
- We continue with lots of student activities after hours and strong adult catechetical programs.
- We registered 120 new families this year bringing our total registered families to 1,995.

- Baptisms totaled 47 for the year, 89 First Communions and 89 Confirmations.
- Our Sacramental programs were restructured this year as we work toward our goal of enhanced family catechesis.
- Our FLOCK program is flourishing under our new Coordinator. Our family events have taken family catechesis to a whole new level.
